

## WNALC Update

What a privilege to represent New Covenant again. Attending were 64 ladies representing 21 States and Canada: 53 delegates, 6 former council members and 21 visitors. We were welcomed by Amy Werner (Chair), singing the Hymn "Be Thou My Vision", followed with prayer by Rev. Amy Little, who spoke on discipleship and believes Christianity is no longer declining. Unbelievably, not all churches pray the Lord's prayer! The NALC is growing – 34 Districts, 548 congregations. Continue believing in the power of God and our Core values: Christ centered, Mission Driven, Traditionally Grounded and Congregationally Focused.

Mary Bates spoke on Disaster Relief. Not enough workers. On-line training for 3 weeks. You need to gain the trust of the people first and understand what they are going through. Pray with them, staying spiritually core.

Rev. Carol Fryer, Director of Missions, spoke on the Great Commission Funds, support and grants. We have 21 global workers, each receiving \$12,000. WNALC voted to support the Great Commission Relief and the NALC Disaster Relief funds.

Following lunch, guest speaker, Rev. Patti Morlock, Associate Pastor at St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Grove City, Ohio spoke on "Run the Race of Life and Faith". Write down your faith in letters to your family. Run the Christian race – 1 Peter 2:2; Hebrews 12:1. Do you share the Word of God eagerly? We must get rid of sin if we want to win. Run with perseverance. God sets the course; he planned it that way. 2 Timothy 4:7-8. Fix our eyes on Jesus, John 5.

#### **NALC Bi-Annual Convocation**

Pam Henderson and I attended the Convocation the first week of August. The theme of the meeting was: Running with Endurance: Fixing Our Eyes on Jesus and the Bible Verse: Let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith." (Hebrews 12:1-2)

The Convocation celebrated fifteen years together with a clear commitment to the authority of the Bible and the urgent call to faithful mission. The NALC has grown to 543 congregations. There was a lot of focus on mission and Global Workers. The NALC currently sponsors 21 Global Workers, many of whom were present and shared displays and conversations about their ministry. Elections were held for leadership positions. Revision to the NALC Constitution were made. The Treasurer reported that the NALC has zero debt. The Proposed Budget. which is a statement of faith and a stewardship plan for fiscal responsibility, was presented and approved. Total Revenue: \$4,615,000; Total Expenses: \$4,606,822

Worship was uplifting and unifying. Music included both hymns and praise songs. With almost 600 people in attendance, most activities flowed smoothly. The agenda was followed and completed. The business of the NALC was presented and handled well and on time, with few exceptions. Pam and I are grateful to New Covenant Lutheran Church and the NALC for allowing us this opportunity to represent our community of faith.

If you are like me, you believe that our Heavenly Father put us together with Thrive Church to bless us with what both New Covenant and Thrive each need...a church that is home for worship and praise, and one that will allow us to do outreach to our local community, region, and more. It is exciting to work towards our December 1st closing and dream of using that space to God's glory! After Thrive's bold step of deciding to still sell their church to New Covenant even when the potential for their new property didn't work out, Pastor Kidd of Thrive has asked our prayers for progress in their new negotiations for a property which has a building "that you can put three of Thrive's current church buildings inside of!"... the skating rink just off of South Sterling Street. They hope to be able to reach an agreement with the current owners by mid-September.



Please pray for New Covenant, as well, as we work through the "Due Diligence" phase in reaching that December 1st goal. In addition to the basic due diligence, Howy Copenhaver has had many thoughts on what needs to be completed and has provided an extensive list (which he says is not all encompassing) from which we are working. So far: an Inspection of the property has been completed with no real surprises, several brief face-to-face meetings with the attorney have taken place to make sure we are on track, three people together explored the eight acres, a survey has been completed, documents pertinent to sufficiency of funds have been forwarded, logistics and timing for our move to the new location have been discussed and a preliminary plan made, online manuals for every piece of equipment have been procured, insurance for the new building has been discussed and will timely be put in place, and more...

We will join in worship and communion with Thrive Church on Pete Brittain Road on November 30th, prior to our moving in. Plans for the move: Come ready on November 23, after our final service in the leased space, and we'll move out!
