Oswald Chambers, 1874-1917, a Scottish evangelical Bible teacher and military chaplain (who died) in Cairo, Egypt, during World War I. Author of the spiritual classic, *My Utmost for His Highest*.

It is a snare to imagine that God wants to make us perfect specimens of what He can do; God's purpose is to make us one with Himself.

The emphasis of holiness movements is apt to be that God is producing specimens of holiness to put in His museum. If you go off on this idea of personal holiness, the dead-set of your life will not be for God, but for what you call the manifestation of God in your life. "It can never be God's will that I should be sick" [you might say]. If it was God's will to bruise His own Son, why should He not bruise you? The thing that tells for God is not your relevant consistency to an idea of what a saint should be, but your real vital relation to Jesus Christ, and your abandonment to Him whether you are well or ill.

Christian perfection is not, and never can be, human perfection. Christian perfection is the perfection of a relationship to God which shows itself amid the irrelevancies of human life. When you obey the call of Jesus Christ, the first thing that strikes you is the irrelevancy of things you have to do, and the next thing that strikes you is the fact that other people seem to be living perfectly consistent lives. Such lives are apt to leave you with the idea that God is unnecessary, that by human effort and devotion we can reach the standard God wants. In a fallen world this can never be done. I am called to live in perfect relation to God so that my life produces a longing after God in other lives, not admiration for myself. Thoughts about myself hinder my usefulness to God. God is not after perfecting me to be a specimen in His show-room; He is getting me to the place where He can use me. Let Him do what He likes.

### **Convocation Update**

The Carolinas Mission Region of the North American Lutheran Church held its 2025 Convocation on May 2-3, 2025 at Christ's Lutheran Church, Stanley, NC. Three items were voted on and passed, which included: the constitutional amendment allowing each church to have up to two delegates at future convocations; the 2025-26 budget; and the annual ministry support.



Attendance at the convocation included: 39 Clergy, 33 Lay delegates, for 72 Total voting. Also in attendance were one Clergy visitor, five Seminarians, 41 Visitors/guests for a total of 119 registered attendees. With 56 congregations in the Mission Region, 39 were represented and 17 were not.

The Reverend Bill White, Eastern Area Assistant to the Bishop, provided an update on NALC activities. Other presentations primarily focused on external missions supported by the Mission Region and included: Fish Stix Ministry, Rehoboth Ethiopian Mission, Sharing Shepherds, Kairos Prison Ministry, Guatemala Mission Trip, Disaster Response, Water Missions International, Feed the Hunger Pack-a-Thon, Congo Ministry International, SMI Haiti, and the Malawi Orphan Care Project.

At the Catawba Valley Mission District gathering, Karen Duncan volunteered and was elected to be the lay member to serve a three-year term to the Carolinas Mission Region Council.

Next year's Convocation will be held May 1-2, 2026 at Christiana Lutheran Church in Granite Quarry, NC in the Piedmont East Mission District.

If you ask New Covenant's delegate, Karen Duncan, what was the best part of the convocation she would tell you it was learning about the number and diversity of the missions of the Carolinas Mission Region and the North American Lutheran Church. A close second was the worship services. She would also strongly encourage every member of New Covenant to plan to attend a future convocation. *Karen Duncan, Delegate*
